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COVID-19 VIRUS

The Red Cross recommends the following steps to help prevent the spread of germs:

- 1) Stay home if you can & avoid gatherings of more than ten people.
- 2) Practice social distancing by keeping a distance of about six feet from others.
- 3) Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after being in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- 4) Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.
- 5) Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- 6) Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care.
- 7) Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing; throw used tissues in the trash. If a tissue isn't available, cough or sneeze into your elbow or sleeve, not your hands.
- 8) Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily.
- 9) If surfaces are dirty, clean them - use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection; and 10) Wear a facemask if you are sick. You should wear a facemask when you are around other people (e.g., sharing a room or [vehicle](#)) and before you enter a [healthcare](#) provider's office.

According to the CDC, COVID-19 symptoms include fever, shortness of breath and a cough. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure. Call your doctor for medical advice if you think you have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop symptoms.
